Analysis of Data: SIR

-Annual student exhibitions, senior capstone exhibition and portfolios documented.

Program results are satisfactory. It has been possible to see evidence of this since the creation of a capstone exhibition course.

Action Plan based on Assessment Results and Analysis: With a new curriculum in place and the creation of the capstone exhibition course new data/evidence is now available to make assessment more efficient. Results will continue to be review to find areas that need improvement.

Time Frame for Action Plan: Fall 2016 and Spring 2017. Five students will be exhibition as a result of AR499, the capstone exhibition course, the most in one year since it was created and made a required course in the curriculum. Exhibitions will be documented and reviewed by faculty for assessment purposes. This will continue in 2017-18

What actions have been taken since the previous assessment of these outcomes.

AR499, the capstone exhibition course and AR440 Contemporary Art are now required of all program majors.
