Survey Says... Student and Faculty Surveys for AY 2023-2024

In Fall 2023, Georgian Court began to implement the Higher Education Data Sharing (HEDS) Consortium student surveys, beginning with the new student and returning student surveys (Transfer). Results were shared with the Provost Council and other appropriate offices. Additional information is available in the Office of Institutional Assessment and Accreditation (OIAA).

During the spring semester, students will be asked to complete either the HEDS student satisfaction survey (undergraduates) or the GCU graduate student survey. Distribution dates are February 7-21, 2024. At the end of January, faculty and selected staff, and adult students (age 25+) were asked to complete surveys related to the NJ Credit for Prior Learning Grant.

GCU Teaching Strengths



Every semester, GCU faculty are asked to reflect on their teaching. This year, the survey was distributed through HelioCampus so that faculty could keep a record of their responses on their HelioCampus assessment dashboard. They choose one course most likely to teach again and consider what changes may be needed to improve their teaching and student learning.
