Survey Says... Survey Schedules for AY 2022-2023

The schedule of surveys for AY 2022- 23 will include the suite of student engagement surveys administered through the <u>Center for Postsecondary Education Research</u>, Indiana University.

1. BCSSE was administered to first year and transfer students at orientation in August.

2. NSSE will be administered to first-year and senior students during the spring semester—March 8-28, 2023. At the same time, the GCU Graduate Student Survey will be distributed to graduate students.

- 3. FSSE will be distributed to full-time faculty from March 21– April 5.
- 4. All of these engagement/satisfaction surveys will be cross-referenced in the reporting process.



Student Feedback on Courses

GCU students give course feedback using the AEFIS (Assessment, Evaluation, Feedback & Intervention System) and the GCU Student Evaluation of Teaching (SET) survey. Results are given below. Mean scores are taken from Section 2: Teaching Effectiveness.

GCU began using the AEFIS software system in fall 2019. Increased usage of the system for course feedback and program assessment continues.
