Third Quarter & Final Report Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students July 1, 2021 – September 30, 2021

QUARTERLY & FINAL REPORT

1. Georgian Court University has agreed to the terms of the Department's Certification and Agreement. The University intends to use the applicable amount of funds received under the CRRSAA (a)(1) to provide Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students.
2. Georgian Court University received **\$845,168** from the Department pursuant to the institution's Certification and Agreement for Emergency Financial Aid Grants to Students.
3. The total amount of Emergency Financial Aid Grants distributed to students under Section (a)(1) of the CRRSAA as of September 30, 2021: **\$845,168**
4. The estimated total number of students at Georgian Court University eligible to participate in programs under Section 484 in Title IV of the Higher Education Act of 1965 and thus eligible to receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants to students under Section (a)(1) of the CRRSAA: **1,444 students**
5. The total number of students (duplicated) who have received an Emergency Financial Aid Grant to students under Section 18004(a)(1) of the CRRSAA: **1,449 students**

6. The method(s) used by Georgian Court University to determine which students receive Emergency Financial Aid Grants and how much they would receive under Section (a)(1) of CRRSAA: Block grants amounts were based on enrollment status, including full time, part time, three-quarter time, and less than full time. Pell eligible students received larger grant amounts per enrollment category than non-Pell eligible students. Funds were allocated for extreme hardship circumstances and required an application with substantiating documentation. Funds were prioritized for students who are Pell eligible and students who are low income, not Pell eligible.
7. Georgian Court University distributed the following instructions, directions, and guidance to students concerning the Emergency Financial Aid Grants:
